VETERANS

A military transcript grants 4 hours of PE credit for basic training, with the remaining coursework subject to evaluation for transfer. A TRANSFER STUDENT DEFINED

Determining if you are a transfer or first-year student can be confusing, especially if you've taken college-level coursework in high school. Essentially, there are two questions to ask:

- Have you enrolled in a long semester of college (fall or spring) after graduating from high school?
- Are you a veteran?

If your answer to either of these questions is yes, you're a transfer student!

Transfer students have already graduated from high school and have enrolled at a regionally accredited college for at least one long semester of 12 or more credits (fall or spring). Enrolling in a college the summer after high school graduation does not count as a long semester and will not count toward transfer consideration.

Veterans, regardless of college enrollment or credits, are always considered transfer students.

The TCU Transfer Community includes 1,536 enrolled students.

TRANSFER CREDIT

Most college level courses with a grade of "C" or better will transfer.

All courses are individually assessed for application to the TCU core curriculum. Course equivalency is subject to change. Other classes may transfer or fulfill degree requirements. Updated August 2024.
