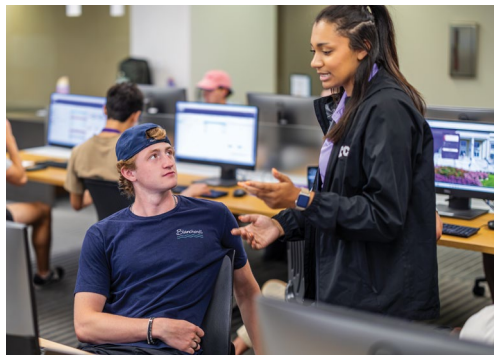

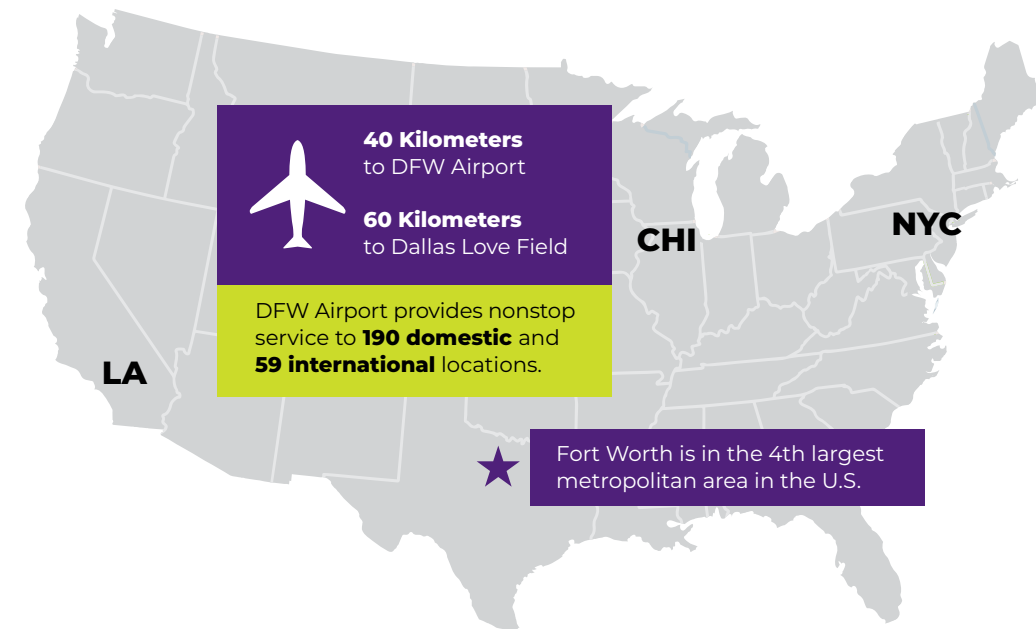

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY

- Completion of at least three years at a high school or college where English is the language of instruction
